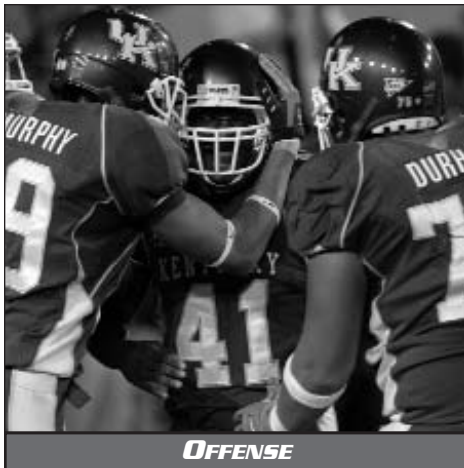

SUSTAINING

SUCCESS

Following two of the most exciting seasons in Kentucky football history, the question becomes if the Wildcats can continue that momentum into the 2008 season.

Coach Rich Brooks – known for his forthright opinions – emphatically believes the answer is “yes.”

Brooks and the Wildcats are coming off consecutive eight-win campaigns, including back-to-back championships of the Gaylord Hotels Music City Bowl and a victory over eventual national champion LSU. Despite the graduation of one of the most accomplished senior classes ever to wear the Blue and White, Brooks believes the upcoming season is a time to move forward.

“I think we can be a very, very good football team, although we have a lot of work to do,” said Brooks, who was rewarded with a contract extension in the off-season. “Our (2007) senior class was well-known and did a great job. We also have talented players ready for their chance, just as the

departed seniors did when they came into the program.”

A total of 55 lettermen, including 13 returning offensive and defensive starters, was bolstered by a large group of redshirt freshmen during spring practice. What Brooks saw in the spring has given him confidence.

“There isn’t any reason this team can’t be a competitive force in the SEC East and be in postseason play again,” Brooks said.

OFFENSE

Kentucky rolled up a school-record 475 points a year ago, but the coaching staff must replace stalwarts such as quarterback André Woodson, tailback Rafael Little, tight end Jacob Tamme and wide receivers Keenan Burton and Steve Johnson, all of whom received All-SEC honors during their careers.

The battle to succeed Woodson has drawn the most attention. The two leading contenders, junior Curtis Pulley and sophomore Mike Hartline, finished the spring in a virtual tie and will resume their competition in August.

“I felt a lot better about the position at the end of spring practice than I did at the beginning,” Brooks said. “It’s always better to have two good quarterbacks than one. They (Hartline and Pulley) are both playing at a level that we can win. And, let’s not forget about Will Fidler.”

Coming off a redshirt season, the dual-threat Pulley was the backup in 2005 and ’06. He completed 60.9 percent of his passes (39 of 64) in that role while running for 280 yards and three touchdowns.

Hartline was the No. 2 QB last season, completing 4 of 6 passes for 34 yards in limited duty. He also has good mobility. Soph Will Fidler looked much improved in the spring after recovering from a shoulder injury.

“The starting quarterback could emerge in August, but I’m not going to make a hard and fast game plan, to say that I have to make a decision by a certain time,” Brooks said. “We might go into the first game playing more than one quarterback, but I’ll just have to see how it plays out.”

The question of who will catch the ball also is in the air. Senior Dicky Lyons, who caught 56 passes for 655 yards and seven touchdowns last season, is an obvious choice at one wide receiver spot. Junior DeMoreo Ford, who has 20 catches in his career, hopes to return in August after missing the spring because of a knee injury. Sophomore Kyrus Lanxter, redshirt freshman Anthony Mosley, and converted cornerback E.J. Adams showed flashes of ability in the spring.

“The wide receiver position is still our biggest question mark going into the season,” Brooks said. “The key there will be the health of DeMoreo Ford, if he is ready to go. Our other receivers have to show they can be productive consistently. We signed several freshman receivers, and that is a position that freshmen can make major contributions quicker than other positions.”

One question appeared to be answered in the spring, as juniors T.C. Drake and Ross Bogue looked ready to step in at tight end. Both players caught the ball well and are capable blockers.

The situation at tailback also seems in good shape, despite the loss of Little. Senior Tony Dixon (958 career rushing yards, nine TDs), junior Alfonso Smith (399 career yards, four TDs), and sophomores Derrick Locke (521 yards, five TDs as a freshman) and Moncell Allen have ability and experience. Fullback John Conner is a punishing lead blocker, as well as a capable runner and receiver.

A year ago, even though three starters had graduated from the 2006

offensive line, Brooks predicted that the '07 O-Line would be the best it had been since his arrival. That estimate proved correct, as the Wildcats piled up a school-record point total and posted the team's best rushing yardage in a dozen seasons.

And, although two more regulars from last season have moved on, Brooks again believes that the 2008 offensive line will be UK's best during his term. A total of nine lettermen and three redshirt freshmen had intense competition during the spring.

The returning starters are senior left tackle Garry Williams, junior left guard Zipp Duncan and junior right tackle Justin Jeffries. Williams, the team's most experienced blocker with 28 career starts, was named second-team Coaches All-SEC last season. As a former tight end/defensive end, Duncan has excellent athletic ability and can play either guard position. Duncan and Jeffries, who also is a notable athlete, are likely to be much-improved after a year of starting experience.

Senior Christian Johnson was the team's starter at left guard in '06 and actually edged ahead of Duncan by the end of spring. Former junior-college All-American Jess Beets opens fall drills as the No. 1 right guard, pushed hard by redshirt freshman Stuart Hines. Duncan could wind up there if that is the most effective combination. Junior James Alexander and soph Brad Durham have game experience at the tackles.

The center position also is open. Junior Jorge Gonzalez has seen brief game action, and is backed by redshirt freshman Jake Lanefski and soph Marcus Davis.

DEFENSE

The Kentucky defense significantly lowered yardage allowed last season, from 453.4 yards per game in 2006 to 397.2 yards per game in '07. With 17 of the top 22 players from the Music City Bowl depth chart returning, including eight starters, there is legitimate hope for further progress under second-year defensive coordinator Steve Brown.

"I think this can be the best defense we've had since I've been here," Brooks said. "Overall, we made some progress last season, but we didn't make the strides we needed to make against the run or on third-down. In my mind, we have to make significant improvement on defense this year."

The first task on defense is replacing All-SEC linebacker Wesley Woodyard, UK's leading tackler the last three seasons and the SEC's top tackler a year ago. The development of Micah Johnson at middle linebacker enabled the coaching staff to move former middle linebacker Braxton Kelley to Woodyard's spot on the weak side. A three-year starter with 189 career tackles, Kelley made a good adjustment to the new post.

Johnson, who made 58 tackles last season, moves up to the starting job in the middle. He also has been a factor in pass defense, coming up with two interceptions and five pass breakups a year ago.

The strongside spot was manned last season by Johnny Williams (43 tackles) and Sam Maxwell (27 stops, including five for loss). Williams brings additional flexibility with the ability to contribute at end.

Junior Mikhail Mabry brings veteran depth at middle linebacker. Michael Schwindel and Jacob Dufrene also have some game experience.

The picture also is encouraging up front. Junior Jeremy Jarmon emerged as one of the league's best pass rushers last season, accounting for 62 tackles, 13.5 tackles for loss and nine quarterback sacks. Senior Ventrell Jenkins made an encouraging move from tackle to end during the spring and looms as a starter there. Nii Adjei Oninku, a starter in 2006, returns to action after missing last season because of injury. Linebacker Johnny Williams also played some snaps at end in the spring.

The starting tackles are back, senior Myron Pryor (27 tackles last season) and junior Corey Peters (43 stops). Sophomores Ricky Lumpkin and Shane McCord provide talented depth and redshirt freshman Luke McDermott made a strong showing in the spring.

There is plenty of competition in the secondary, where three starters, six additional lettermen, and four redshirt freshmen are available. Tread Lindley has blossomed as an outstanding cover cornerback, leading the team last season with three pass interceptions and 11 pass breakups. Paul Warford (two interceptions, nine PBU) has been the other starter at corner, but senior David Jones played well in the spring and they enter fall ball bracketed as co-starters there.

Seniors Shomari Moore (three career interceptions) and Robbie McAtee, along with redshirt freshman Randall Burden, provide excellent depth at cornerback.

Senior Marcus McClinton, hobbled by injuries last season, hopes to return to his sophomore form at free safety when he generated multiple turnovers and other big plays. Providing depth for McClinton, and vying for playing time at the open strong safety position, are juniors Ashton Cobb and Calvin Harrison, and talented redshirt freshmen Matt Lentz, Greg Wilson and Taiedo Smith.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Kicker Lones Seiber, who made 16 of 25 field goals last season, and punter Tim Masthay, who averaged a career-best 39.8 yards per boot, are returning starters at their positions. Both are challenged by redshirt freshman Ryan Tydlacka. Sophomore long snappers Brad Hart and J.J. Helton are back in their unsung, vital roles.

The return game must be revamped following the departure of kickoff returner Keenan Burton and punt returner Rafael Little, who were among the best in school history at their positions.

Dicky Lyons has seen game action as a punt returner. Lyons, Tony Dixon, Derrick Locke, Alfonso Smith and David Jones have returned kick-offs during their careers.

Linebacker Johnny Williams also practiced at defensive end during the spring.

BROOKS EARNS CONTRACT EXTENSION; PHILLIPS NAMED COACH OF THE FUTURE

Following two of the most exciting and successful seasons in school history, Coach Rich Brooks has been rewarded with a contract extension through the 2011 campaign.

With an eye on his eventual retirement, the 66-year-old Brooks recommended that offensive coordinator Joker Phillips be named the head coach of the future in order to secure continuity in the program for current players and future recruits.

UK Director of Athletics Mitch Barnhart agreed with the recommendation. Phillips – a native of Kentucky, former Wildcat player, and long-time assistant coach – accepted the offer on Jan. 19.

Phillips' success as offensive coordinator and proven ability as a recruiter had made him the target of several coaching searches among some of the top teams in college football and in the National Football League.

BACK-TO-BACK SUCCESS

Kentucky posted identical eight-win campaigns and championships of the Gaylord Hotels Music City Bowl in both the 2006 and 2007 seasons.

It was the first time that UK had consecutive eight-win seasons since 1976-77 and marked the first time since the 1950 and '51 seasons that the Wildcats won bowl games in consecutive years.

The goal for 2008 is a third-straight post-season berth, something accomplished only once in school history, 1949-50-51. Winning a bowl three years in a row would be an unprecedented feat in Wildcat annals.

DEFENSIVE NUMBERS SHOWED IMPROVEMENT

Under first-year defensive coordinator Steve Brown, the Kentucky defense lowered yardage

allowed from 453.4 yards per game in 2006 to 397.2 yards per game in 2007.

And, in 2007 the UK defense allowed 23.8 points per game in regulation play (not counting points allowed in overtime or scored vs. the UK offense or special teams). That was an improvement from the 27.3 points per game surrendered when the Wildcat defense was on the field in 2006, again not counting points allowed in overtime or scored vs. the UK offense or special teams.

The best news is that, with the return of 17 of the top 22 defenders from UK's Music City Bowl depth chart, there is legitimate hope of continued improvement in the coming season. In addition, the defense will be bolstered by a dozen more defenders who did not play last season because of injury or redshirting.

OFFENSIVE NUMBERS UP

Kentucky has made notable progress on offense the last three seasons, improving points and yards per game each year. The advancements coincided with the maturing of a young group of players along with the appointment of Joker Phillips as offensive coordinator in 2005.

POSITION CHANGES WORKED WELL

The Kentucky coaching staff made several position changes during spring practice which seemed to work very well.

- Senior Ventrell Jenkins, a career reserve at defensive tackle, projects as a starter in 2008 after moving to end during the spring.
- Braxton Kelley, a three-year starter at middle linebacker, has moved to weakside linebacker.
- Johnny Williams, the starting strongside linebacker, also will see spot duty at defensive end.
- Former quarterback Matt Lentz made a great impression at strong safety during the spring.
- E.J. Adams, caught in a numbers game at cornerback, showed playmaking ability in the spring at wide receiver. In the first spring scrimmage, he caught four passes for 167 yards and a touchdown.
- A.J. Nance looked at home in his new position at fullback after moving over from linebacker.

THURMOND JOINS COACHING STAFF

Kentucky has one change in the coaching staff for 2008. Chris Thurmond, whose coaching experience includes a stint in the SEC at Alabama, replaced David Lockwood as UK's defensive backs coach.

CATSCELLANEOUS

- **Tailback Derrick Locke made a big impression in both football and track and field during his true freshman year of 2007-08.** In addition to rushing for 521 yards in football, Locke was named NCAA Indoor Track and Field All-America and set the UK freshman long-jump record with a leap of 25 feet, 5 1/4 inches. During outdoor track and field season, Locke was named to the Freshman All-SEC team.
- **Kentucky has had a first-team Academic All-American each of the past three seasons.** Punter Tim Masthay also was a second-team Academic All-American a year ago.
- **UK will enter the 2008 season** with an active streak of nine consecutive non-conference wins, the most since a 17-game non-conference win stretch from 1954-60.
- **With 25 victories at Kentucky,** Coach Rich Brooks already ranks seventh on the UK career win list among the 35 men who have been head coach of the Wildcats. Brooks was a finalist for the 2007 Liberty Mutual National Coach of the Year Award.
- **With Joker Phillips and Steve Brown as offensive and defensive coordinators,** Kentucky is the first school in Southeastern Conference history to have African-Americans in those roles at the same time.
- **Kentucky has won 13 of its last 19 games,** with six of those wins being fourth-quarter come-from-behind triumphs.
- **Kentucky has won eight of its last 11 games** decided by 10 points or less.
- **Junior cornerback Trevard Lindley** enters the season with 23 pass breakups in his career, only four away from the UK career record of 27 by Antoine Huffman.
- **As summer workouts began, only two Wildcats** – wide receiver Jonathan Gholson and linebacker Brandon Thurmond – were considered doubtful to participate in the 2008 season because of injuries.
- **The Kentucky cheerleaders did it again in January, winning an unprecedented 16th national championship** – including 12 of the last 14 – at the annual Universal Cheerleaders Association competition.

Thurmond had not worked with Rich Brooks before, but quickly made a good impression, as Brooks indicated how well Thurmond interacted with the Wildcats during spring practice.

Under Thurmond's guidance, Brooks said that senior cornerback David Jones might well have been the team's most improved player during spring ball.

WHO'S THE QUARTERBACK?

The competition to succeed André Woodson at quarterback will carry into preseason practice – and perhaps into the season itself.

Junior Curtis Pulley and sophomore Mike Hartline were evenly matched during spring practice. Also contending is sophomore Will Fidler, who looked much improved in the spring after recovering from a shoulder injury in 2007. Three freshman signees will join the mix in August.

Pulley, the most experienced candidate, red-shirted last season. As the backup QB in 2005-06, Pulley completed 39 of 64 passes for 280 yards while also rushing for 273 yards. Hartline completed 4 of 6 passes for 34 yards as the backup last season.

SEEING RED(SHIRTS)

For the first time since his arrival as head coach, Rich Brooks was able to hold out a majority of his freshman class during the 2007 season.

Sixteen redshirt freshmen will be looking to earn playing time when fall practice begins, including three offensive linemen and nine defensive players. Only six true freshmen garnered playing time in '07.

JARMON HAS BUSY OFF-SEASON

Junior defensive end Jeremy Jarmon, who earned All-SEC honors in 2007, was a busy man during the off-season.

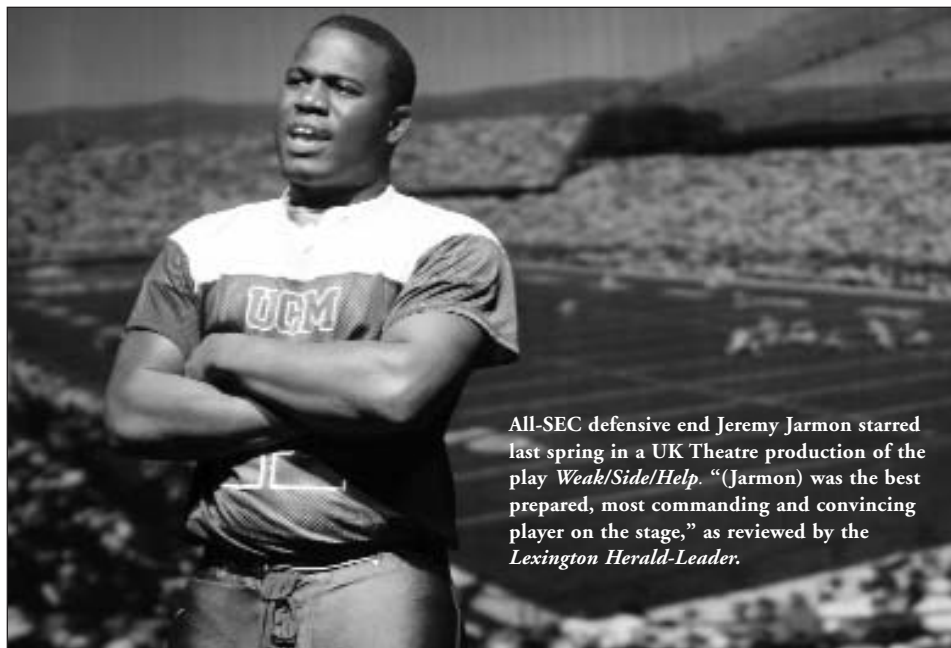
In the midst of spring practice in April, Jarmon also played a starring role in the UK Theatre production of the play *Weak/Side/Help*. Jarmon received excellent reviews for his performance. In high school, Jarmon portrayed Col. Nathan Jessep – the Jack Nicholson role – in the play *A Few Good Men*.

A political science major, Jarmon is considering a career in a branch of public service.

SCHEDULE NOTES

Once again, Kentucky will play one of the nation's most difficult schedules, as six Wildcat opponents played in bowl games a year ago ... UK played a schedule rated as the fifth-toughest in the nation last year, according to the Colley Matrix computer system that is used in the BCS rankings.

UK will play Norfolk State and Western Ken-

tucky for the first time in school history ... The Wildcats take on Middle Tennessee for the first time since 2002.

Kentucky opens Southeastern Conference play at Alabama, which replaces LSU as a rotating opponent on UK's league schedule. The Wildcats last played in Tuscaloosa in 2003 ... The Arkansas game is the UK Homecoming; the Razorbacks have a new coach this season in Bobby Petrino.

MASTHAY TRAVELS TO GHANA

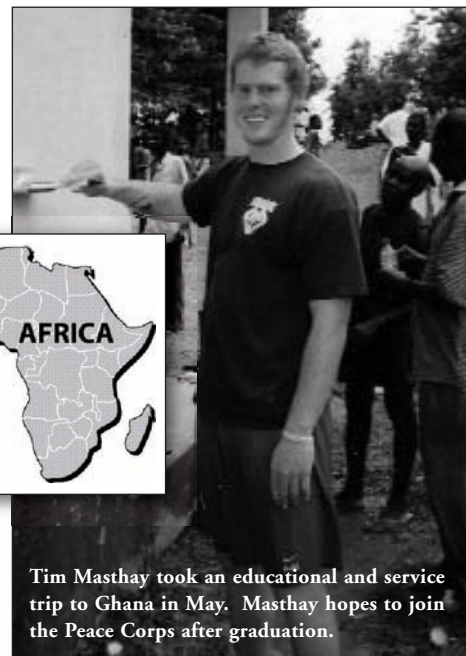
Wildcat punter Tim Masthay proudly displays a tattoo of his home state of Kentucky on his right arm but his loyalties reach far beyond the Commonwealth's lines. He holds a passion in his heart for the people of the world. This passion led the Murray, Ky., native on an educational and service trip to the African country of Ghana in May.

"I have an interest in serving other people and my country," said Masthay, a senior economics major whose goal is to one day serve in the Peace Corps. "I knew this trip would be a great learning experience and would make me a better citizen and person. You think you have an idea of what poverty is and what's happening in Africa but until you smell the smells, hear the sounds and taste the tastes, you don't really know."

The two-week trip was sponsored by the UK Education Abroad program and led by Dr. Kwaku Addo, associate dean of the UK Graduate School. The group of approximately 10 students from UK and Prairie View A&M University in Texas went on a study tour that involved visiting

landmarks and learning the culture of Ghana. They also participated in a service project at a school and orphanage.

"Talking to the people was fascinating," Masthay said. "They have a strong desire to provide for their families and they yearn for education. One of my friends asked a middle-school age girl if she liked going to school and she said, 'I like school like I like water.' Guys my age were working small jobs just to save money to go to school. At the university, dorm rooms were as big as ours at UK but 10 people would share a room. It makes you realize the opportunity we have here."
