### WILDCATS TAKE TO THE ROAD AGAINST INDIANA

After opening the season on a six game home stretch, the Kentucky Wildcats take to the road for the first time, traveling to Bloomington to take on longtime rival Indiana.

UK's trip to Bloomington is its first game in Assembly Hall since the 1990-91 season. The Wildcats are 2-7 on the Hoosier's home floor. Prior to last season's matchup in Lexington, the UK-IU series was played on a neutral site between Louisville and Indianapolis for 15 consecutive years. However, a schedule conflict with Louisville's Freedom Hall led to the series being moved to Rupp Arena last season, where Kentucky recorded a 59-54 win over the Hoosiers.

Kentucky leads the all-time series with Indiana, 28-22, having won six of the last seven and 11 of the last 13 games in the series. The two traditional basketball powers have met every year since the 1969-70 season.

### CAT SCRATCHES

- Kentucky is in its 105th season of basketball.
- Kentucky is the all-time NCAA leader in wins with 1,952.
- UK last won in Assembly Hall in the 1981 season, a 68-66 victory.
- The Wildcats rank sixth nationally and lead the SEC in field goal percentage defense (.344). UK also leads the conference in scoring defense (58.5).
- Kentucky is shooting 77 percent (82-107) from the free throw line, which leads the SEC.
- Patrick Patterson has three double-doubles, tied for the second-highest total in the SEC.
- Kentucky has used five different starting line-ups through the first six games of the season. The only constants have been Mark Coury and Patrick Patterson.
- Joe Crawford (1,010) became UK's 54th member of the 1,000-point club against North Carolina. He currently sits in 52nd place. Teammate Ramel Bradley is 68 points shy of 1,000.
- Once again, every Wildcat basketball game will be televised live, including UK's two exhibition games. UK is on CBS seven times, ESPN/ESPN2 nine times, ESPNU twice, FSN South five times and Lincoln Financial Sports six times.

## SCOUTING INDIANA

Located in Bloomington, Ind., (171 miles northeast of Lexington), Indiana is a member of the Big Ten conference.

One of the Wildcats' most storied rivals, the Hoosiers possess a basketball tradition matched by few. Indiana, which owns the third-most national championships in the country (5) and the fifth-most NCAA tournament appearances (34), ranks as the ninth winningest program in NCAA history with 1,611 wins.

Indiana is led by 6-4 freshman guard Eric Gordon, who has a 24.3 scoring average, and 6-9 senior forward D.J. White who is averaging a team best 8.6 rpg.

A defensive minded team, the Hoosiers are holding opponents to just 41.6 percent from the floor and 32 percent from three-point range.

The Hoosiers play their home games in Assembly Hall (17,357) where they own a 22-game winning streak. They are 175-17 (.911) all-time at Assembly Hall against non-conference foes.

Indiana is led by second-year man, Kelvin Sampson (483-269/24 years). Sampson led IU to a 21-11 record in his inaugural season at the helm, guiding the Hoosiers to their 34th NCAA Tournament appearance.

## SERIES HISTORY

This is the 51st meeting between Kentucky and Indiana, with the Wildcats leading, 28-22, including last season's 59-54 UK win in Rupp Arena. Kentucky has won six of the last seven and 11 of the last 13 games in the series.

Prior to last season's game in Lexington, the UK-IU series was played on a neutral site between Louisville and Indianapolis for 15 consecutive years. However, a scheduling conflict with Louisville's Freedom Hall forced the series to Rupp Arena for the first time since 1989.

This year's match-up marks the first time since Dec. 18, 1990, that the series has been played in Assembly Hall in Bloomington, a place UK has gone 2-7 and has not won in since Dec. 6, 1980 (68-66).

## HOOSIER STATE SUCCESS

Over the years, the Wildcats have met with success against schools from the state of Indiana. Kentucky possesses a 91-47 (.659) record against teams from the Hoosier State, with most of the action and success coming versus Notre Dame, against whom the Cats are 41-17.

UK is 22-28 all-time in Indiana, but has won six of seven in the Hoosier state this decade (2-0 in South Bend; 4-1 in Indianapolis).

## LAST TIME VS. INDIANA (12/9/06)

The Wildcats fended off Indiana with hard-nosed defense down the stretch, beating the Hoosiers 59-54, in front of 24,253 fans at Rupp Arena. In a brutally physical game it was the Cats who held firm, holding Indiana to just one field goal over the final four minutes.

Trailing by three (57-54), the Hoosiers were unable to connect on a three-pointer. Freshman Jodie

Meeks then nailed two free throws with 5.8 seconds to ice the game.

Randolph Morris (16-10) and Bobby Perry (11-10) led the Wildcats with a pair double-doubles.

## UK VS. BIG TEN OPPONENTS

Kentucky owns a 92-55 (.626) record against current members of the Big Ten. The Cats' most common opponent has been Indiana, against whom UK owns a 28-22 record.

## SIBLING RIVALRY

UK senior Joe Crawford will face off against his brother Jordan for the first time. Jordan, a 6-4 freshman guard, came to Indiana via Hargrave Military Academy.

Joe currently leads the Wildcats in scoring (18.3) and free throw shooting (17-19, .895). Jordan is averaging 12.6 ppg and 25.0 minutes for the Hoosiers.

## KENTUCKY-INDIANA CONNECTIONS

- UK walk-on Dusty Mills hails from Noblesville, Ind. He played at Noblesville High School, where he competed against Hoosier freshman star Eric Gordon.

- While they aren't necessarily Kentucky-Indiana ties, Kentucky head coach Billy Gillispie and Indiana coach Kelvin Sampson are familiar with one another from their Big 12 days. Gillispie led Texas A&M while Sampson skippered the Oklahoma Sooners. The two had a two-year crossover during the 2005 and 2006 seasons. Sampson holds a 4-0 record against Gillispie from their time in the Big 12.

- This won't be the first time Gillispie or UK assistant Tracy Webster have experienced a little Big Ten flavor. Before getting his break as a head coach at UTEP, Gillispie was an assistant coach under Bill Self at Illinois in the 2001 and 2002 seasons, when the Illini went 2-1 against IU. Webster is a Big Ten alum, having graduated and played three seasons at Wisconsin, where he was a three-year letterman and three-time team captain. In addition to his playing career, Webster spent a year as an assistant coach at Purdue and (2004) and three-years as an assistant at Illinois (2005-07)

## CRAWFORD, PATTERSON AMONG SEC BEST

Senior Joe Crawford (4th, 18.3 ppg) and freshman Patrick Patterson (9th, 16.3 ppg) are among the SEC's top 10 in scoring, while Patterson is one of only three SEC players (the only freshman) to rank among the top 10 in both points and rebounds (3rd, 8.8 rpg).

Crawford also leads the league in free throw percentage (.895), while Patterson is sixth in field goal percentage (.635).

Senior Ramel Bradley is among SEC leaders in free throw percentage (3rd, .844), assists (12th, 3.7) and three-point percentage (5th, .464).

## CATS DISPLAY STIFLING DEFENSE

The Wildcats have displayed a stifling defense early in the season, holding opponents to just 58.5 ppg and .344 shooting, both tops in the SEC.

Kentucky also ranks third three-point field goal percentage defense (.269).

In addition, the Wildcats field goal percentage defense ranks sixth in the country.

Four of UK's six foes have been held under 35 percent shooting. Also:

- UK's 83-35 win over Texas Southern marked the fewest points UK had allowed in 12 years, since a 96-32 win over Morehead State in December 1995.

- Texas Southern shot just 21 percent from the field, the second time UK has held a foe to a percentage that low.

- Central Arkansas shot only 20 percent in the season opener. Those are the two lowest opponent field goal percentages allowed by UK in the last decade.

### FREE THROW SUCCESS

Kentucky leads the Southeastern Conference in free throw shooting (.766) led by league leader Joe Crawford (.895). Ramel Bradley is third in the SEC in free throw percentage (.844), while Patrick Patterson ranks 13th (.750).

The Wildcats also rank 22nd in the nation in free throw shooting percentage, while Crawford checks in at 44th in the country.

### 1,000 POINT CLUB

Joe Crawford became the 54th member of Kentucky's exclusive 1,000 point club against North Carolina. Fellow senior Ramel Bradley is also within reach of the milestone.

Crawford can now concentrate on moving up the charts with 1,010 career points (he currently ranks 52nd), while Bradley isn't far behind with 932 career points. Crawford is averaging 18.3 ppg so far this season while Bradley checks in at 14.0.

### INJURY UPDATE

The Wildcats have battled their fair share of injuries already this season. Thus far Kentucky has endured the following:

- Jodie Meeks - Fractured pelvis, early Nov. (Out 4-6 weeks; has missed four games)
- Derrick Jasper - Microfracture surgery on left knee, June (Has not yet seen action this season)
- Jared Carter - Shoulder surgery on right shoulder, June (Missed offseason conditioning time)
- Joe Crawford - Arthroscopic surgery on left knee, late summer (Missed offseason conditioning)

- Ramon Harris - Stress fracture in left foot, early Nov. (Missed first four games)

- Michael Porter - Concussion, Oct. (Missed practice time)

### PATTERSON DOUBLES UP

Patrick Patterson is tied for second in the SEC with three double-doubles.

Patterson's double-double against Gardner-Webb, in only his second collegiate game, was the earliest a Kentucky freshman had recorded a double-double since Jules Camara posted 10 points and 11 rebounds in the 1998-99 season opener against Eastern Kentucky.

Patterson's back-to-back double-doubles against Gardner-Webb and Liberty marked the first time a Wildcat freshman achieved the feat since Jamal Mashburn in the 1990-91 season.

He is one of only nine UK freshmen to record three double-doubles, and the first since Jared Prickett in 1992-93.

### MORE DOUBLE-DOUBLES

Patterson wasn't the only Wildcat in double figures against Stony Brook. Sophomore Perry Stevenson recorded the first double-double of his career against the Seawolves, scoring a career-high 18 points and pulling down a career-best 10 rebounds.

It was the first time since last year's 59-54 win over Indiana that two Wildcats recorded double-doubles in the same game (Randolph Morris - 16 points/10 rebounds; Bobby Perry - 11 points/10 rebounds).

### 20-10

When Patrick Patterson recorded 23 points and 10 rebounds against Liberty, he became the first Kentucky freshman to record a 20-10 game since Jason Parker notched 22 points and 13 rebounds against Southern California in the 2001 NCAA Tournament.

### STARTERS?

Kentucky has used five different starting lineups through six games. Eight different players have started, with the only constants being Mark Coury and Patrick Patterson.

### SHOOTING SHINES VS. TEXAS SOUTHERN

Kentucky made 61 percent of its field goals against Texas Southern, its highest in a game since making 63 percent last season at South Carolina (1/16/07).

The Wildcats shot 77 percent (17-of-22) in the first half against TSU.

## UNPARALLELED TRADITION

The Wildcats own an unparalleled tradition of success. Since 1903, the University of Kentucky has fielded 105 basketball teams. The first national championship was an NIT title in 1946. The first NCAA title came in 1948 and the latest, No. 7 occurred 1998. No other program can claim the unparalleled success that matches the Wildcats' efforts over the past century.

### SEC DOMINATION

Since the SEC's inception in 1932-33, the Wildcats have been the most dominant team in the league, recording an 841-229 mark (.786). Only one other team has won more than 680 regular season SEC games (Alabama) and no other team has a better winning percentage. UK has averaged 11.4 wins and 3.1 losses per season in 73 seasons in the SEC.

- The Wildcats have won 43 SEC titles and 25 SEC Tournament Championships, more than the other 11 teams combined.
- Kentucky has won 10 of the last 16 SEC Tournament titles.
- UK has won 11 SEC East titles in the 16 seasons since the league expanded.

## NATIONAL EXPOSURE

Kentucky has 16 games scheduled for national broadcast this season on CBS, ESPN or ESPN2 this year.

UK has nine games on ESPN/ESPN2, including North Carolina (12/1, ESPN2), UAB (12/15, ESPN), Houston (12/18, ESPN), San Diego (12/29, ESPN2), Mississippi State (1/15, ESPN), Florida (1/19, ESPN), Tennessee (1/22, ESPN), Vanderbilt (2/12, ESPN) and Georgia (2/19, ESPN).

The Wildcats also have seven games slated for broadcast on CBS: Indiana (12/8), Louisville (1/5), Vanderbilt (1/12), Georgia (2/2), Arkansas (2/27), Tennessee (3/2) and Florida (3/9).

## THREE MANIA

UK has the nation's third-longest active streak of consecutive games with a made three-pointer. UK has hit a three-pointer in 650 consecutive games, which trails only UNLV and Vanderbilt.

The Wildcats' last game without a three-pointer came 19 seasons ago against Seton Hall on Nov. 26, 1988, a "three-point" loss in the Great Alaska Shootout.

As of Dec. 4, UNLV and Vanderbilt have hit a three-pointer in every game since the three-point rule was adopted to start the 1986-87 season. The Rebels' streak is 673 games, while Vanderbilt's streak is 670 games.

## CATS ROCK AT RUPP ARENA

- UK has won 64 of its last 79 home games. The Cats were 14-2 at home last season and are 405-52 (.886) all-time in Rupp Arena.
- UK has won 19 national attendance titles in the building, including 11 of the last 12.
- The Rupp Arena attendance record of 24,465 was set last season against Florida on Feb. 10.
- The Wildcats have posted a remarkable 230-34 (.871) record in regular season SEC games played in Rupp.

## IN SEASON HONORS

Patrick Patterson received his first and the team's first SEC award of the season when he was named the SEC Freshman of the Week on 11/26.

## PRESEASON HONORS

Ramel Bradley and Joe Crawford were selected to the coaches' SEC Preseason All-SEC team. Bradley was named to the eight-man first team, while Crawford was on the second team.

Bradley was also named to *Athlon Sports'* preseason All-SEC third team while sophomore Jodie Meeks was selected a second-team member.

*The Sporting News* named Patrick Patterson the SEC's Top Freshman.

## SEC PREDICTIONS

Once again, the Wildcats have been selected as one of the top teams in the SEC. Kentucky was selected second in the SEC East behind Tennessee by media members throughout the conference.

UK was tabbed for a second place finish in the East as well by *Blue Ribbon*, *The Sporting News*, *Lindy's* and *Athlon Sports*.

## CATS IN THE RANKINGS

The Wildcats were tabbed 20th in the Associated Press preseason Top 25 and 22nd in the ESPN/*USA Today* preseason Top 25. UK has been ranked nationally in the preseason every year since 1991-92.

The Wildcats were picked in the top 25 of several other preseason publications. *Blue Ribbon* magazine has Kentucky as high as 11th, while *Lindy's* tabbed the Cats for 21st. *The Sporting News* picked the Wildcats at the 24th best team in the country.

## BIG BLUE MANIA

### KEIGHTLEY RETURNS FOR 47TH SEASON

Equipment manager Bill Keightley returns for his 47th season with the UK basketball team. The beloved "Mr. Wildcat" began assisting in the equipment room during the 1961-62 season and since then, UK has played 1,439 games, owning a 1,099-340 (.764) record.

Kentucky, which has fielded 105 teams, has played 2,561, meaning Keightley has played a role in 56.2% of the games.

The Lawrenceburg, Ky. native, who has a jersey retired in the rafters of Rupp Arena, has worked under six different head coaches at UK - Rupp, Hall, Sutton, Pitino, Smith and Gillispie. The current Cats have a modern nickname for the 80-year old Keightley -- "Smooth."

### "SUPER FAN" IN 55TH SEASON

UK fan Bob Wiggins, 79, continues his amazing streak of following the basketball Cats. The 2007-08 season is his 55th watching Kentucky in person and through its own record-keeping, he has attended 1,389 UK games.

His home-court streak spans 46 years and 667 games. During that period, which dates back to 1960-61, UK has a home record of 589-78 (.883).

## COACHING HIGHLIGHTS

- Billy Gillispie is a three-time finalist for the Naismith National Coach of the Year award. He won the honor in 2004, 2005 and 2007. In addition, he was named a finalist for the 2007 Jim Phelan National Coach of the Year honor.
- Gillispie is a three-time conference coach of the year winner. He was the consensus Big 12 Coach of the Year in 2005 while the *Austin American-Statesman*, *The Dallas Morning News*, *San Antonio Express-News* and the *Fort Worth Star-Telegram* tabbed him the Big 12 Coach of the Year in 2006. He won the honor again in 2007, when the Big 12 coaches tabbed him the conference's Coach of the Year.
- Gillispie is also a three-time district coach of the year winner. At the conclusion of the 2004 season, he was named the USBWA District Coach of the Year. He received the honor again in 2005 as well as the NABC District Coach of the Year award. In 2007 he was selected the NABC District 9 Coach of the Year.

- He led Texas A&M to 27 wins in 2006-07, the most in school history.
- Gillispie also led Texas A&M to three straight 20-win seasons for the first time in history.
- In 2004-05, A&M had the best turnaround in the nation and the best in school history.
- Texas A&M won 31 Big 12 games in three years under Gillispie after winning just 25 in the first eight years of Big 12 play.
- Gillispie is the only coach in college basketball history to coach the nation's most improved team in consecutive seasons (2003-04 and 2004-05).
- His 2003-04 UTEP team tied for the most improved team in college basketball history (+18 wins).

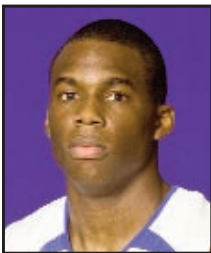

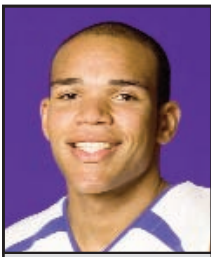

Joe Crawford scored 20 points and No. 20 Kentucky began the Billy Gillispie era with a 67-40 victory over Central Arkansas in the opening round of the 2K Sports College Hoops Classic.

The Wildcats advanced to the second round against Gardner-Webb, which defeated Alabama A&M 69-55.

Crawford, a senior guard who started most of the previous year, was among the last players on the team to see action, not appearing until 13 minutes in.

He was promptly whistled for palming but then started taking over the offense, going 7-of-11 from the field - including two dunks.

Sophomore forward Mark Coury cracked Gillispie's first starting lineup and needed less than 90 seconds to match his career high of four points as Kentucky got off to an 8-0 lead. Coury used a combination of jumpers and layups to account for 10 of Kentucky's first 12 points.

Coury finished with 13 points and 10 rebounds.

The Bears missed their first nine shots, including five from 3-point range, and didn't score until junior center Landrell Brewer hit two free throws more than five minutes in.

Central Arkansas's shooting fortunes didn't improve much as Kentucky held the Bears to 20 percent shooting, including only 12 points in the paint compared to 38 for the Wildcats.

Kentucky led 34-20 at halftime despite shooting just 40 percent. The Wildcats picked up the pace in the second half with 56 percent.

Durrell Nevels led Central Arkansas (0-1) with 10 points.

After point guard Ramel Bradley was called for a technical foul early in the second half to give him four personals in the game, Gillispie spent nearly an entire timeout screaming at the referee. The fans, slow to notice the coach's tirade, roared approval when they finally did.

Gillispie also made substitutions on virtually every dead ball, often bringing in players for just one offensive or defensive play.

The winner of the four-team Lexington regional of the tournament benefiting Coaches vs. Cancer advances to the semifinals on Oct. 15 at Madison Square Garden in New York. No. 3 Memphis, Oklahoma and Connecticut are hosting regionals.

Grayson Flittner scored 22 points to help Gardner-Webb beat No. 20 Kentucky 84-68 in the 2K Sports College Hoops Classic.

Kentucky, Division I's winningest program, hadn't lost a regular-season game to a mid-major since falling to Western Kentucky on Nov. 15, 2001, in that season's opener. It lost to UAB in 2004 in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.

Kentucky's last home loss to an unranked nonconference foe was Dec. 3, 2005, against North Carolina.

The tournament, benefiting Coaches vs. Cancer, had been set up to send four top programs -- No. 3 Memphis, Connecticut, Oklahoma and Kentucky -- to New York next week to play in the semifinals.

However, instead of the Wildcats, Gardner-Webb, which finished 9-21 last season and tied for seventh in the Atlantic Sun Conference, will play the winner of Thursday night's game between Buffalo and Connecticut.

As it turned out, the Wildcats never had control of this game, trailing 14-0 just four minutes in, missing its first four shots and turning the ball over four times during that span.

Flittner hit a critical 3 midway through the first half that opened the Bulldogs' lead to 26-10.

Kentucky cut the deficit to seven less than three minutes later on a long jumper by Joe Crawford but would get no closer.

Crawford, a senior guard and regular starter last year, didn't crack the starting lineup for the second consecutive game under Billy Gillispie despite leading the team with 20 points Tuesday against Central Arkansas.

Gardner-Webb led 38-27 at halftime, and Sanders began the second half with a three-point play to put the Wildcats deeper into a hole.

Among the lone bright spots for Kentucky were its two blue chip freshmen, power forward Patrick Patterson and guard Alex Legion.

Legion tried to single-handedly carry the Wildcats midway through the second half, hitting three 3-pointers and making a key steal in just over two minutes.

Patterson had 12 points and a game-high 12 rebounds, including 10 in the first half that accounted for half the Wildcats' total.

"They came to play," Patterson said of Gardner-Webb. "Obviously we didn't."

A night after holding Central Arkansas to 20 percent shooting - the Wildcats' best defensive performance since 1995 -- Kentucky allowed the Bulldogs to make 53 percent.

Kentucky was ice cold shooting, hitting just 36 percent. Ramel Bradley led all scorers by tying a career high with 24 points and going 14-for-14 from the foul line.

But every time Kentucky made a basket, the Bulldogs seemed to make a bigger one.

Joe Crawford had a career-high 32 points in his first start of the season and Kentucky cruised past Texas Southern 83-35.

The Wildcats won for the second straight time. It was their largest margin of victory since beating Vanderbilt 106-44 on Mar. 5, 2003.

Crawford, a senior guard who was a regular starter last year, made a major case that he should get his job back under new coach Billy Gillispie.

He matched a career-best with 12 field goals on 17 attempts and provided a spark in the first half from beyond the arc and a spark in the second from the paint.

Up 6-5 early, the Wildcats scored the next 15 points -- 10 of them from Crawford -- to bury the Tigers.

Crawford hit two free throws to begin the streak after drawing a foul on a fourth-chance shot. Then, 11 seconds later, Crawford intercepted a pass and cruised alone down the court to finish with a dunk. He'd add two 3-pointers to pad the lead.

During another span in the second half, Crawford began to misfire from long-range, so he took the ball to the hoop. He made a fastbreak layup, then set a career-high with a 3-point play on an alley-oop from fellow senior Ramel Bradley.

Kentucky made 61 percent of its shots (77 percent in the first half). The Wildcats dominated the much smaller Tigers in the paint with freshman power forward Patrick Patterson, who had 21 points and seven rebounds.

The Wildcats made five of their first seven shots from beyond the arc, and Patterson made his first eight shots from the field, mixing layups and dunks with finesse jumpers.

Texas Southern connected on just 21 percent of its shots and was overmatched on the boards in the first half, failing to get its fourth rebound until 15 minutes had passed. Three Wildcats -- Patterson, Crawford and Bradley -- had more first half rebounds than the Tigers' team leader.

Patrick Patterson had 19 points and matched his career-high 12 rebounds as Kentucky survived a sloppy start and pulled away from Stony Brook 62-52.

Stony Brook trailed by 19 points in the second half but clawed back to cut the lead to 43-37 with less than seven minutes left on a 3-pointer by Michael Tyree. Perry Stevenson dunked home a missed shot seconds later, as the Wildcats padded the lead.

At least for one game, Stevenson -- a specialist at blocking shots -- provided Kentucky a scorer in the post alongside Patterson. He recorded his first career double-double with personal bests of 18 points and 10 rebounds.

Both teams were ice-cold out of the gate, combining for just 10 points in the first 10 minutes.

Kentucky misfired on 12 of its first 13 shots in that span, connecting only on Patterson's put-back of Joe Crawford's missed 3-pointer. Kentucky didn't score again from the field until Patterson's dunk with 9:32 left in the half.

Stony Brook couldn't take advantage of Kentucky's early shooting woes. The Wildcats trailed by just two points after Patterson's dunk and took the lead for good at 14-12 four minutes later on Stevenson's jumper from the free-throw line.

Kentucky went on an 8-0 run the last two minutes of the first half and led 26-14 at the break.

But if Kentucky's offense was poor, Stony Brook's was worse. The Seawolves didn't get their first assist until four minutes into the second half and finished with just five in the game.

Defensively, the Seawolves were outmatched by the bigger Wildcats. Seven different Kentucky players blocked shots, compared with none for Stony Brook.

Stony Brook's Mitchell Beauford led all scorers with 20 points.

Tyler Hansbrough made 10 of 12 free throws as top-ranked North Carolina capitalized on Kentucky's 25 fouls and beat the Wildcats 86-77.

With Hansbrough closely guarded, reserve Danny Green led the Tar Heels with a career-high 20 points.

Hansbrough finished with 14 points and a game-high 11 rebounds, his third double-double of the season.

Patrick Patterson, Kentucky's blue-chip freshman power forward, held his own against North Carolina's tough frontcourt.

Billy Gillispie said he was pleased with the effort. He surprisingly even labeled Perry Stevenson's performance the best of the year, despite scoring only two points and playing just eight minutes. Hansbrough said Patterson did provide a challenge.

"He's a solid big man," Hansbrough said. "He's very physical and he can get you into weird positions because they run so many things to him."

Up 44-39 early in the second half, the Tar Heels went on a 13-0 run to put the game out of reach. Bobby Frasor finished the streak with two 3-pointers, the last one silencing the Rupp Arena crowd as he pumped his fist.

Patterson ended the Kentucky drought by drawing a foul and hitting one of two free throws, but that was Kentucky's first trip to the line. By then, North Carolina had taken 14 free throws, making 13.

Kentucky's defense helped the Wildcats play with North Carolina early, but every time the Wildcats made a big basket, Green, a junior swingman, seemed to have an answer.

He scored North Carolina's last 10 points of the first half, eight of them in a span of just over a minute, using 3-pointers to answer a 3 by Joe Crawford and a dunk by A.J. Stewart, then a layup to answer Crawford's layup.

It was Green's sixth straight game scoring in double digits, all as a reserve.

Kentucky's regular point guard, Ramel Bradley, was not in the lineup for the tipoff. Bradley entered less than two minutes in, but had only two assists. He did score 19 points, as did Patterson. Crawford led the team with 21.

The Tar Heels led 37-32 at halftime. Patterson scored the first bucket of the second half to cut the deficit to three points, but the Wildcats would get no closer.

Kentucky leads all Division I programs with 1,952 wins, while North Carolina is second at 1,921.
